Calendar Year 2020 Report on the Utilization of Breast Cancer Research and Education Funds

State Finance Law §97-yy requires the New York State Department of Health (Department) to submit an annual report to the Legislature, the State Comptroller and the public regarding how the monies of the Breast Cancer Research and Education Fund (Fund) were utilized during the preceding calendar year. The statute specifically requires the Department to report on the following five items:

- i. The amount of money disbursed from the Fund;
- ii. Recipients of awards from the Fund;
- iii. The amount awarded to each recipient;
- iv. The purposes for which such awards were granted; and
- v. A summary financial plan for the current and succeeding fiscal years.

The enclosed table represents a snapshot of each of these requirements.

A total of \$1,283,529.35 was disbursed during calendar year 2020 to twenty-one (21) breast cancer research contractors: three (3) were awarded funding through the "Peter T. Rowley (Round 3)" RFA (Request for Applications), two were awarded funding through the "Patricia S. Brown (Round 5)" RFA, seven (7) were awarded funding through the "Peter T. Rowley (Round 4)" RFA, one was awarded funding through the "Patricia S. Brown (Round 6)" RFA, two were awarded funding through the "Healthcare Practitioner Breast Cancer Education Research Projects (Round 2), and five (5) were awarded funding through the "Peter T. Rowley (Round 5)" RFA. Additionally, funding was disbursed to one miscellaneous services contract for merit peer review of scientific and education research applications.

The purpose of the Rowley contracts is to stimulate and support research related to breast cancer biology, causation, prevention, detection or screening, treatment (including treatment of its effects), survivorship or cure. Any investigative approach appropriate to the application topic may be pursued, including, but not limited to, basic, translational, clinical, demographic, mapping, epidemiological, environmental, behavioral or psychosocial research. The purpose of the Brown contracts is to encourage the development and implementation of innovative pilot projects in breast cancer risk reduction education and propose the design of new educational strategies to elicit behavioral changes intended to reduce specific risk factors associated with developing breast cancer. The purpose of contracts from Healthcare Practitioner Breast Cancer Research Education Projects is to stimulate breast cancer education research projects that will develop communication skills and educational programs targeted to certain healthcare practitioners, with the goal of facilitating partnerships with and fostering breast health literacy among their patients.

The Health Research Science Board (Board) expects outcomes of supported activities to benefit subsequent breast cancer research or education efforts, breast cancer public health policy and the continuum of breast cancer care.

The Board recommended eight research awards for funding from the "Peter T. Rowley (Round 6)" Request for Applications. These awards are expected to begin in 2021.
